Trial 1: Handler’s Briefing at 9 a.m., judging to follow both days

Trial 2: Handler’s Briefing no sooner than conclusion of Trial 1, judging to follow both days.

The A/B Sections: The Novice A class is for beginners. Those dogs who have earned a title in that element (in AKC or in another organization), and those handlers who have worked as professional detection dog handlers must enter the B section. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/divisions. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of qualifying scores.

Move Ups between trials WILL be offered. Written notice of Move Up must be submitted to the Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes before the Handler’s Briefing

“DAY OF” ENTRIES FOR TRIALS 2

Exhibitors who complete their Novice title at Trial 1 may ENTER the Advanced Element at Trial 2 by submitting a paper entry form to the Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes before the Handler Briefing for Trial 2 begins. This is NOT a Move-up and additional entry fees will be charged.

Please remember that by AKC rules, dogs who have not completed their Novice title MAY NOT enter the Advanced Class. We have added “Day of” entries for Trials 2 to accommodate exhibitors who complete their Novice title during Trial 1 and wish to Move Up. We will accommodate these entries if limits allow. If we have more exhibitors that wish to move up than we have space for, we will have a RANDOM DRAW no less than 30 minutes after Trial 1 concludes and prior to the start of Trial 2.

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word “dog” is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog’s physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

Preference will be given to BEAGLES.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

COLUMBIA-WILLAMETTE BEAGLE CLUB is **NOT** offering a wait list. No entries may be withdrawn with a refund after closing on APRIL 15. Any on-line entries made that are not accepted because entries are full or for any other reason the Club declines to accept the entry will be refunded in full via PayPal. No entry fees for Trials 2 collected on May 5 and/or 6 will be refunded.

“DAY OF” ENTRIES FOR TRIALS 2 ONLY will be accepted by paper entry form only at the show site. “Day of” entry fees must be paid by cash or check payable to Columbia-Willamette Beagle Club. No credit cards or Pay Pal payments for “Day of” entries. Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check taken for Trials 2 on May 5 & 6.

No entries will be accepted by mail, phone, email, or fax. Hand delivered entries will only be accepted at the show site for Trial 2 on May 5 and 6.

No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Denied Pay Pal payments do not constitute a valid entry.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Placement rosettes will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place.....Blue

Second Place.....Red

Third Place.....Yellow

Fourth Place.....White

A **Dark Green ribbon** will be awarded for qualifying scores.

A **High in Trial rosette** will be awarded

- ◆ In Trial 1 both Saturday & Sunday: In Novice Class (teams must participate in Novice A or B Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried)
- ◆ In Trial 1 on Saturday: In Advanced Class (teams must participate in Advanced Interior & Container)
- ◆ In Trial 2 on Saturday: In Advanced Class (teams must participate in Advanced Exterior & Container)
- ◆ In Trial 1 on Sunday: In Advanced Class (teams must participate in Advanced Interior & Exterior)
- ◆ In Trial 2 on Sunday: In Advanced Class (teams must participate in Advanced Exterior & Interior)

A **High Beagle in Trial rosette** will be awarded in each Trial to the Beagle that meets the High in Trial requirements described below.

Only teams who participate in all elements offered in a trial and qualify in each are eligible to win **High in Trial**. A High in Trial is awarded at each difficulty level. There is no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections.

The High in Trial is determined by adding the team’s faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team’s times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win.

A **New Title rosette** will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

The **Handler's Briefing** will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of the classes, after the hides have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing.

A **warm-up area** will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blanks containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

Search Area Conditions. Searches may be indoors, on carpeted, wood, concrete, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces.

The trial venue is a campground and some of the terrain is uneven. The search areas are a fair distance from the parking lot and staging area (up to 350 yards). Some of the interior searches have up to two steps at the entrance.

Search Area Sizes as follows: Nov Container(250-400sqft.), Nov Interior(100-200sqft.), Nov Exterior(200-400sqft.), Nov Buried (150-200sqft.), Adv Container (400-600sqft), Adv Interior (220-400sqft), Adv Exterior (400-800sqft)

Crating at these trials will be primarily in the handlers' cars in the parking lot. There is no shade in the parking lot. There may be limited designated outdoor crating space depending on the weather. A very few dogs may be crated inside a small space in the staging area at the discretion of the trial chair. People who feel they need an indoor crating area should email their request to twainheart@comcast.net along with their reasons for requesting an indoor space. Indoor crating cannot be guaranteed. Crates may not be left overnight.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Prohibited Substances. The use or possession of alcohol, tobacco (in any form whether smoked or smokeless or vaping), marijuana, illegal drugs (in any form), and firearms (including fireworks of any kind) is absolutely prohibited on the site and on all property owned or occupied by Lewis River Campground. This includes personal vehicles. Any exhibitor found to be in possession of prohibited substances may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. If appropriate, law enforcement will be called.

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future. Any exhibitor found to be visiting the site prior to the posted start time of the trial may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area". Any exhibitor found to be in possession of target odor may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be ask to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

Maintaining the Integrity of the Search Site. If anyone is found to be discussing a search before the class has ended, both parties in the discussion (speaker and listener) will be penalized with a "Not Qualified" score (NQ) for the class and they may be excused from the trial and asked to leave the grounds by the Event Committee. This includes Spectators. Handlers are responsible to make sure that Spectators they bring/invite to the trial know this rule.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING UP AFTER THEIR DOGS!! Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. There will be a designated exercise area that exhibitors are asked to use to minimize the area we must patrol to make sure we leave the grounds clean.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The American Kennel Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The American Kennel Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the American Kennel Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. Nothing may be hanging from the dog's collar or harness, except that a wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

HEALTH OF DOGS

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN

At check-in you will receive your armband number and running order. Check-in time is 8-8:45 for Trial 1 both days, 12:00-12:45 for exhibitors participating in only Trial 2 both days.

Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered.

PHOTOGRAPHS AND VIDEO

The Columbia-Willamette Beagle Club may photograph and/or video searches and other parts of these trials. Please be aware that by entering these trials you consent to your voice, name, and/or likeness being used, without compensation, in films, tapes, social media, publications, and/or websites by CWBC. The photographs/video remain the sole property of the Columbia-Willamette Beagle Club.

Exhibitors are welcome to photograph and/or video their own dogs either by enlisting a person or using a Go-Pro camera or the like as permitted by AKC rules. Exhibitors are encouraged to display photos and/or videos of their own dogs in social media and/or websites. However, no person should post or otherwise display photos and/or videos of dogs they do not own without explicit permission from the dog's owner/handler.

Judges may photograph and/or video the searches they are judging for the purpose of their own education. Judges' photographs and/or videos may not be displayed or used for any purpose other than their own review without explicit consent of the CWBC and/or the dog's owner/handler.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers who are selected to assist at the trial(s) will receive entry preference. We will accept up to 20 volunteers each day. Volunteers will be selected according to their experience in the position(s) they are volunteering for and the needs of the trial. Volunteers who are given an assignment during a class in which they are entered will run their dog prior to assuming their assignment. To volunteer, complete the on-line volunteer form at www.cwbeagles.com

Deadline to submit volunteer form and be considered for entry preference is 5:00 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time on Sunday, April 15.

There will be no food concessions on site at this trial

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

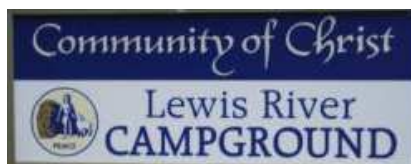
